


Sage Reinhart was named Mercury All-Area Player of the Week after helping to lead the Trojans to a 41-40 double overtime victory against Great Valley.



- Steve Verbit Steve starred at Pottstown High School in both baseball and football. A three year letterman in baseball, he was All-ChesMont his senior season leading the Trojans to their 2nd straight ChesMont crown. He was a two year letterman in football earning All-ChesMont honors his junior and senior years as a DB. The Trojans were ChesMont champs his senior season. He played in the Montgomery County All-Star Game, and the All-Philadelphia Area Classic at Franklin Field. Verbit earned a full scholarship to Delaware and played football there for legendary coach Tubby Raymond. He stayed on after graduation and coached at Delaware for 6 years, and helped lead the Blue Hens to a national championship in 1979. He has been coaching at Princeton for the last 27 years. He has helped develop 15 All-Ivy League players as a Defensive Coordinator, and has served as Defensive Line Coach and Associate Head Coach at Princeton.
- Michael Missimer Michael was the epitome of the term student-athlete while at Pottstown High School. He excelled in both baseball and basketball as well as in the classroom. He was in the National Honor Society, graduated in the top 5 of his class, and was named Outstanding Student-Athlete in the Class of 1973.
