

The newly formed robotics teams, sponsored by mathematics teacher Mr. Robert Decker and



David and his father owned and managed a 110-acre dairy farm in Berks County. In addition to working the farm, David worked at Doehler Die Casting Co., and had part time jobs driving a school bus and delivery trucks. In 1962 he began his career at First Federal Savings and Loan as a teller. He retired as president of First Federal in 1983 after leading the transition of the Savings and Loan's data systems from paper-based to electronic. His part-time jobs in retirement included proctoring exams for the federal Office of Personnel Management, and driving cars for Kulp's Car Rentals.
- Susan K. (Bedell) Babyak Class of 1976 was the wife of John F. Babyak. Born in Pottstown, PA, she was the daughter of Wilson E. Bedell, Pottstown and the late Carol A. (Young) Bedell.
