In class, students chose a potential career and were then provided with an average salary for that career. Virtual paycheck in hand, they then proceeded to the gymnasium, one class at a time, to visit tables, each representing a necessity that requires a piece of that personal paycheck.

There were tables for housing, for food, insurance, investment, transportation, education and more.



and at toggery shops where clothing is donated. She was also an avid Phillies Fan.


