Pottstown comes together in aftermath of explosion that killed 5 Schools grieving over loss of four children









































Pottstown Celebrates Hometown Hero

PHS Baseball Players Learn Life Lessons

Participating in co-curricular activities is much more than just learning the physical skills of a game. Teamwork, self-discipline, understanding the value of hard work and resiliency are but a few of the lifelong lessons that can be learned by taking part in school activities. Trojan Proud of our high school baseball team for overcoming adversity and demonstrating that hard work pays off.

Hear their story in Coach Petro's own words: After an entire season lost to Covid two years ago, an 0-16 season a year ago, & an 0-18 start to this season, the Pottstown Trojans Boys Varsity Baseball Team could have rolled over and finished this season the same way it started it. However, they continued to compete! After earning their 1st victory of the season (and 1st under 3rd year Head Coach Chris Petro) with a 15-0 blowout on Tuesday, they found themselves in a 7-0 hole after 2 innings in their season finale. That's when Jadon Wiszumerski, an extremely talented freshman, took the mound. He simply shut the opposition down by throwing 6 innings of shutout baseball that included striking out 12 batters! That performance allowed the offense to chip away at the deficit. They scored 1 in the 3rd, 4 in the 4th, and 2 in the 5th inning to tie the game at 7-7. After 2 scoreless frames, freshman second baseman Evan Draucker singled with 2 outs in the bottom of the 8th. After stealing 2nd and moving to 3rd on a ground ball, senior Joey DeLeo stepped to the plate with the winning run 90 feet away! DeLeo, who had pitched magnificently the day before to earn the victory, lined a ball down the 1st baseline. As the ball found its way past the first baseman, Draucker raced toward home plate with the winning run! The tremendous effort that these young men gave, even when no one would have blamed them for packing it in, gives all of us yet another reason to say "Proud to be from Pottstown!"







Trojans Earn Honors - Break Records in Track

Congratulations to Pottstown High School boys and girls track teams on an outstanding recordbreaking effort at the Perkiomen Valley Invitational track meet. Our student athletes ran, jumped and threw in competition with 18 schools from southeast PA. Trojan Proud of how they represented our district and community.

Place winners for the boys were:

- Ethan Masewicz 1st place in the 200 meters and 1st in the 400 meters with a time of 49.8, which ranks him in the top 10 best times in the state
- RaShean Bostic 1st place in Long Jump 20'-6" which ranks in the state top 50
- The 4x100 meter relay team of Chris Thomas, Tyrese Washington, Izaiyah Wilkerson, RaShean Bostic placed 4th
- The 4x400 meter relay team of Tyrese Washington, Izaiyah Wilkerson, RaShean Bostic, Ethan Masewicz placed 3rd

Place winners for the girls were: (Personal Best Records Set)

- Ashley Weller (sophomore) discus throw of 73 feet 7 inches
- Nashiya Dowling (freshman) 200 meters in 27.96
- Mia Bolman (sophomore) 800 meters in 3:06.9
- Lily Fetterman (junior) 400 meters in 1.19.82
- Mikayla DeLuca (junior) ran the 100 hurdles in 23.11

Medals won and records broken are all a result of hard work paying off which is a good lesson to learn early in life and will result in real life success. Another reason we say Proud to be from Pottstown!



Indoors and Out Trojans Show Hard Work Pays Off

Congratulations to Layla Bearden and Arianna Torres, members of both the Winter Indoor and Spring track teams. Their hard work has paid off in constant improvement in their events of discus and shot put. Bearden started the winter season at the Kutztown Invitational, which drew over 700 competitors from several states. She put the shot 23 feet 3 inches finishing 13th out of 29 competitors. By the final meet of the season she had improved her distance by almost 3 feet with a throw of 26 feet.

Arianna made her debut at the Henderson Polar Bear meet throwing 22-01 and placing 10th overall. By the end of the season her throw of 31 feet 2 inches placed her 3rd overall. Trojan Proud of these student athletes who are proof that hard work pays off.



Overcoming All Hurdles

Tyrese Washington led the Trojan track team at the Pioneer Athletic Conference Championships with a winning time of 14.83 seconds in the 110-meter hurdles. His time not only qualified him for the

PIAA districts, but is one of the top ten times in the state. He also placed 2nd in the 300-meter hurdles.

Adam Green had a strong day with a 3rd place in the hurdles and 6th in the long jump.

The boys 4X100 relay team of Chris Thomas, RaShean Bostic, Braylon Tinson and Tyrese Washington placed 5th.

On the girls' side Ashley Weller took 6th in the shotput and Nashlya Dowling placed 8th in the 100 meters.



Here is the latest update from Mr. Bachman on the academic adventure of our students at the weeklong STEM academy held at Purdue University.


Caden Nihart and Nye Powell tested into the advanced group using ALEKS testing software.



A special thanks to my mother for threatening me whenever I started to slack off. Honest to god for someone like me, I need someone behind me to get me to do things. Thank you, mom, my family, and just every person close to me. It's going to be terrifying, but I'm really curious about what's to come.

As we leave this field, this campus and walk towards an uncertain future, I hope we can try to remain optimistic about what might come. I just wanted to remind everyone, that as we go along with the rest of our lives, to try to be safe, be courageous, be happy. Regardless of our paths, here's to the rest of our lives.

Salutatorian Speech - Jayniana Williams

Good evening friends, families, faculty, administrators, and of course the Class of 2022! It has been an honor to represent all of you, as Class President and to take the position as salutatorian. I am eternally grateful for being bestowed the opportunity to spend the most transformational years with you. Many of the graduates here have inspired me and given me everlasting insights. Please take the time to thank those who have paved the way for you to be here, but also thank yourself. We did it!

I'd like to extend my gratitude to all of the families and audience members who have propelled my fellow classmates forward, to this momentous occasion.

I cannot stand before you today and deliver a speech without thanking the people who have armed me with lessons that I will carry with me for a lifetime. Thank you Kylie - my best friend - for never failing to make me smile. Thank you Savion - my painfully annoying but loving brother - for always challenging me. I strive to forge a legacy and set an example for you. Thank you cheer family - especially coach Megan, coach Emily, Natalia, and Keyora for giving me a second home. Thank you Mr. Bob - my lifelong mentor, for continuously seeing my potential. To my loved ones, thank you for making me the person I am today. And finally, thank you mom for inspiring me through your selflessness and nurturing me throughout the years. Being able to call you all my family has been the greatest reward of all. This day is just as much yours, as it is mine.

For my remarks today, I'd like to share one last class with you all. Today's subject is English, and we will be closely analyzing a word that I'm sure many of you are familiar with. The word: Fear. F-E-A-R. Definition: an emotion caused by the belief that someone or something is dangerous, likely to cause pain, or a threat. Used in a sentence: I fear many things; like the wrath of my mother after I neglect my chores (the audacity!), horror movies, spiders, loneliness, mankind, and on many days - for my life. Mothers fearing that their sons may not return home after they receive a text saying "Mom, a cop just pulled me over." Children who fear for their lives, as they walk into schools. Schools that are meant to be sanctuaries: sacred places where learning should transform the minds of the youth. Young girls who cannot walk home after dark because of the fear that they may never see light again. People in our own community...our own kind..who fear each other. And even in this audience, High school students who feared that they wouldn't live to see their graduation. When will the time come that fear ceases to exist? The truth is, I've learned that fear isn't going anywhere.

Synonyms of fear: control, systemic oppression, injustice. Fear is a means to an end. An end where bigoted, traditional, and tyrannical cycles are perpetuated. This ambiguous emotion is embedded in the very infrastructure of our society, as those in power feed off of your fear. You see, something can be broken in seconds, but it may take forever to fix it, so don't let society break you with fear. Instead, let fear fuel your flame. And when that flame is ignited, breathe life into it, give air to it. So that one day, you may use that fire as a light, to guide you through any darkness that society subjects you to.

Remember that life is not linear. Its volatility presents setbacks and barriers that you may be forced to overcome. I urge you to embrace the presence of fear. Feel it. Relish in it. Grow comfortable with it. Then, it can no longer keep you in its restraint. Utilize courage to rebel against fear, as means to create a better tomorrow for yourself and for future generations. For many of us, the stepping stones have already been laid. Channel the same fear that enabled Dr. King to inspire African Americans to feel a sense of "somebodyness." The same fear that led Anne Frank to reach generations of people through her experiences as a victim of the Holocaust. The same fear that told Miss Harriet Tubman she could escape the chains of injustice and attain liberation.

Sitting here today, as a graduate, is proof that you have the strength to turn fear into courage. You have achieved a feat that many cannot withstand. So, don't stop now because fear may become your friend as you pursue your future endeavors.

The word: Fear. F-E-A-R Definition: a socially constructed emotion which, when combated by courage, lacks the power to deter you from your dreams. Thank you.




Middle School Reading Olympic Team Scores Green

In high school Stanley was a multi-sport athlete, playing on the baseball, basketball and golf teams including, as a sophomore, competing against Arnold Palmer in the Pennsylvania state golf championships. Stanley graduated from Pottstown High School in 1948 and joined the United States Navy, serving as a yeoman second class until 1952. During this time, he served honorably in the Korean War on the USS Rochester, initially in the gunnery department and later transferred to ComServPac in Pearl Harbor. He received commendations for meritorious service and outstanding performance from the US Navy. Stanley worked at Harleysville Insurance Company for 42 dedicated years, starting as a claims adjuster in Lancaster County, PA in 1953, eventually opening a claims office in

Media, PA and serving as District Claims Manager there until 1995. He and his beloved wife of 71 years, Pansy Goodyear Stolar, loved playing golf. After retiring, Stanley and Pansy, his best golf partner, enjoyed many rounds of golf on many beautiful courses during some of their travels. Those travels took them throughout the United States. In addition, they enjoyed several memorable trips to countries in Europe and Central America. He displayed kindness to everyone he encountered, and was always interested in the details of someone else's life. He was curious about life and became a self-trained electrician, plumber and wood craftsman. Stanley was always true to himself and his core beliefs. He was also always true to others as well; he treated everyone with dignity, grace, and respect. When you had a conversation with Stanley, he was fully invested in you, as if you were the most important person in the world at that time. And to him, at that moment, you probably were. Stanley was a profoundly decent man. He was a great role model: As a husband, a father, a grandfather, a great-grandfather, and as a friend to many. We all learned from him. His unique gifts of empathy, curiosity, wisdom, and faith made him always relevant. You wanted to be with him.
