Pottstown School District Superintendent Stephen Rodriguez spoke at a press conference organized





No tax hike in budget


Pottstown School Board to provide tax rebate of \$89





Pottstown School District Beech Street Learning Studio program has been recognized with the 22-23 District of Distinction Award. The award is in recognition of igniting engagement and strengthening confidence for all learners. In its fifth year of operation, Beech Street Learning Studio uses Imagine Learning to provide asynchronous instruction to help students complete their unique learning path to meet graduation requirements. This individualized approach has helped guide 55 students to complete their high school diplomas through the program.

The Imagine Nation Awards are part of the Imagine Learning motivational program. Imagine Learning provides digital-first PreK–12 solutions for core instruction, supplemental and intervention, online courses, and virtual instruction. It serves over 15 million students — partnering with over half of school districts nationwide. More than 21,000 schools and districts throughout the U.S. were eligible for the Imagine Nation Award.

Engineering Students Go Live With Governor's Challenge



When Pottstown High School freshman **Colin Plank** was in middle school and dealing with the isolation brought on by schools moving to 100% virtual classrooms due to the pandemic, he put his musical talent to good use and composed a jazz tune that would undergo a name change from "Trojan Blues" to "Get Lost" and eventually become a successfully published piece of music with the Excelcia Music Publishing Company.

When middle school band director Katie German first heard the tune, she found the melody to be very catchy and offered for the middle school jazz band to perform it, if Colin added some parts for all jazz instruments to play. The young percussionist with a background in piano filled out the composition and the jazz band eventually performed the

piece at their 2021 outdoor spring concert. Former PHS Band Director and current employee of JW Pepper Sheet Music, Joseph Snyder, was at the concert and also found the melody to be very catchy. He suggested Colin submit the piece for publishing.

In the spring of 2022, Excelcia Music Publishing Company chose "Get Lost" as one of their 22 new jazz ensemble pieces for summer release. Colin's composition is now available for bands all over the world to purchase and perform. JW Pepper, the largest sheet music distributor in the world, recognized the piece as one of their "Editors' Choice" pieces.





Due to the rigor of her curriculum, students in Health Occupations need all of that support to meet the expectations mandated by PDE. Her "completers" continually pass the NOCTI and go onto promising careers in Health Care Professions. Michaela collaborates with Pro-Medica Health Service for student clinical experiences, and monitors her students during these clinical experiences. She is currently working on a new internship opportunity for students at Pottstown Hospital. During the Spring of 2023, she will teach a dual enrollment course "Medical Terminology" with MCCC which is being offered at the high school. Outside of the classroom, Michaela coaches winter and spring track, is member of the SAP Team, the ERT Team, she is new teacher mentor, a Basic Life Support Instructor, a Certified Nurse Aide Training Instructor, a member of Second Baptist Church, a mentor for Leading Ladies and President of the Pottstown High School Touchdown Club. 
