Origins of Christianity

History of Jesus of Nazareth

- Christian history begins with Jesus of Nazareth, a Jew who was born in a small corner of the Roman Empire.



- Little is known of his early life, but around the age of 30, Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and had a vision in which he received the blessing of God.

Jesus Becomes a Minister

- After this event, he began a ministry of teaching, healing, and miracle-working. He spoke of the "kingdom of God," condemned religious hypocrites and interpreted the Mosaic law in new ways.



The Messiah

- He spoke before crowds of people, but also chose 12 disciples whom he taught privately. They eagerly followed him, believing him to be the long-awaited Messiah who would usher in the kingdom of God on earth.



Romans Execute Jesus

- After just a few years, however, opposition mounted against Jesus, and he was ultimately executed by crucifixion by the Romans.



Why Was Jesus Killed?

- Jesus was a threat because his speeches could inflame those eager to end Roman rule
- Roman Emperor's were afraid people would stop obeying them and start obeying Jesus demands.

Jesus Rises From the Dead

- Most of Jesus' followers scattered, dismayed.
- 3 days later, women who went to see his body reported that the tomb was empty and an angel told them Jesus had risen from the dead.
- The Gospels go on to say that Jesus, after commanding his disciples to spread his teachings to all people, ascended into heaven

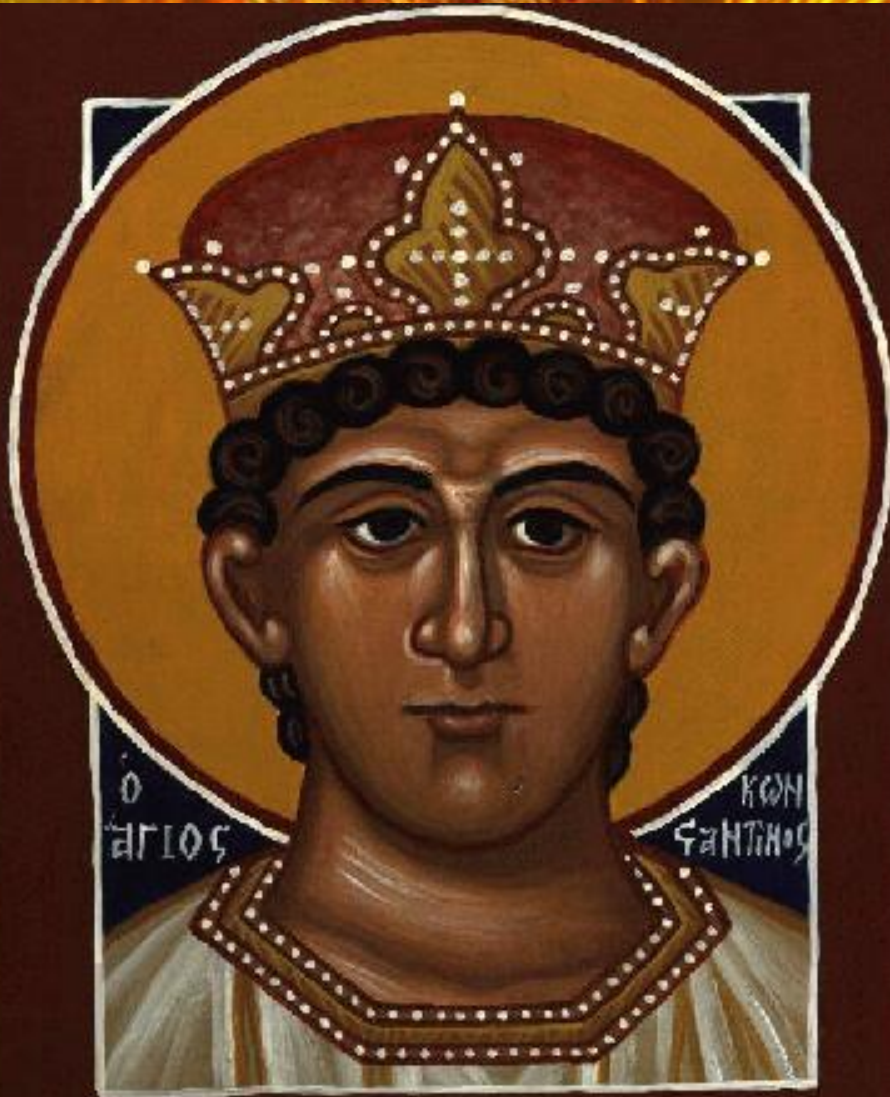


Paul Spreads Christianity

- After the death of Jesus, apostles and other disciples spread the message of Christianity
- Those who accepted the teachings of Jesus were called Christians
- Paul, a Jew from Asia Minor played the most influential role in spreading Christianity
- Paul journeyed around the Mediterranean and set up churches teaching the message of Jesus

Christians Were Oppressed by Romans

- Rome found those who followed Christianity disloyal to Rome because they refused to honor the emperor
- When Christians met in secret, Christians were accused by Romans for engaging in evil practices
- Nero, a Roman Emperor would execute and arrest Christians. Christians who died were called martyrs (People who suffer or die for their beliefs)



- A major turning point in Christian history came in the early 4th century AD, when the Roman Emperor Constantine converted to Christianity.
= (Edict of Milan)

- Emperor Constantine hoped Christianity would be the uniting force of his empire.
- Today Christianity is the largest religion in the world. 2 Billion People.
