Search For the Promised Land

- A group of people claimed an important piece of land- <u>Palestine</u>/Israel.
- This region sat on the eastern edge of the <u>Mediterranean</u> Sea and on the Red Sea, which led to the <u>Indian</u> Ocean.
- Advantageous location for <u>trade</u>.



Ancient Israelites

Ancient Israelites: Were called Hebrews

- Were monotheistic: believing that there was only one <u>God.</u>

-At the time, all other peoples worshiped many gods.

The Torah: Includes the first five books of the Hebrew Bible- that is the books of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy

Abraham

 Abraham is considered the <u>FATHER OF</u> <u>JUADISM</u>

- According to the <u>Torah</u>, a man named <u>Abraham</u> lived near Ur in Mesopotamia.
- God told him to move his family to <u>Palestine</u>, where he would prosper. Abraham promised that he and his people would always <u>obey God</u>.
- God, in turn, promised to always <u>protect</u> them from their enemies.

The Exodus

- Later the <u>Hebrews</u> suffered from the failure of their crops. They moved to <u>Egypt</u>, but over time they were made into slaves.
- After many years, they left in a mass departure that Jews called the <u>Exodus</u>.
- According to the sacred book of the Jews, a man named <u>Moses</u> led them out of Egypt. They wandered <u>40</u> years in a wilderness.


The Second Covenant

 During that time, the story says, Moses received from God the Ten Commandments.

 These were the <u>laws</u> that the Hebrews were to follow. For the second time, God promised to protect these people in return for their <u>obedience</u> to his laws.



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Duties of the Hebrews

- The Hebrews had other leaders called <u>prophets</u>. They said that they were <u>messengers</u> sent by God to tell the people how he wanted them to act.
- These prophets told the people that they had two duties:
 - 1. To worship God
 - 2. To deal in just and fair ways with each other.



Significance of Monotheism

· With monotheism, religion was changing.

Each person was expected to live a moral life.

 The idea emerged that each individual was <u>important</u> and <u>valuable</u> to God; and God was <u>available</u> to everyone
