- Open to 5th – 12th grade students in the Tri-County Area.

All artwork must be created horizontally (landscape) and be no larger than 8.5"x11" in size.
Students may use crayon, watercolor, poster paint, colored pencils, markers or ink. Please do not attach or glue materials that may smear, crack or chip.

- Students must create original artwork; computer generated art and photography will be permitted as long as the piece does not incorporate branded art from other sources.Reproduction of popular cartoon characters or three-dimensional work will be disqualified.

- Students must submit individual, independent work.

- Students must submit a 3-4 sentence statement describing their work and why they chose to create the piece they did.

- Only original artwork will be accepted. Any artwork submitted will not be returned.
