

Congratulations to the Trojan Wrestling team for placing 4th in the Pioneer Athletic Conference Tournament. The team scored 139 points. The three teams scoring more are all ranked in the top ten in Southeast PA. Nine of our twelve wrestlers made the medal round with eight of them advancing to the District Championships next week. For the first time in history the Trojans won more than one individual championship when Mason Pennypacker at 152 pounds and Bryant Wise at 145 were crowned champions. Logan Pennypacker placed 2nd at 138 pounds. Placing 3rd were Bubba Gephart at 120, Saddiq Ibn-Mustafah at 160, and Isaiah Mayes at 170. 




equator and then place the continents in the correct place. They enjoy the balloon globes that we make - we hang them from the ceiling and they enjoy seeing them when they look up.

The high school jazz band performed at the "Grove Jazz Festival" held at Pottsgrove. Nick Wilson received the "Outstanding Trumpet Award."




